

Fred Cosgrove brought in a GTW Pacific steamer road number 5629, but it is not yet numbered. Also, he showed off a GTW trolley. Ed Black's 3 'grand trunks' allowed him to skirt the quarter penalty, just barely. The three examples show the stages of his tree fabrication. Joel Goldberg, with credit given to Ed, brought in a book of plans released by Loew's Stores that show a number of simple home plans intended for New Orleans residents who are rebuilding homes lost to Katrina. The plans are potentially useful to structure modelers. Dave Thornton brought in a GTW book that recounted the operations at the Durand depot at the height of passenger service. Up to six trains could meet and exchange passengers in a one hour period.
