

**Bill Gawthrop** displayed an HO scale Alco 430 decorated for the New York Central.



- 4. Travel by Pullman Book




Steve Weber displayed a NYC box car in HO scale.

**Dean Pyers** offered prototype ashes from the Steam Railroad Institute for use by Dave Thornton on the Detroit Model Railroad Club.


